## Stack Chairs – General Care & Maintenance Instructions

NPS Stack Chairs are built to last, and with a little help from you, they will stay strong and clean for years to come. Here are a few tips:

- Ensure chairs are completely dry before storing to prevent mold and rust.
- Store chairs in a dry, cool place to avoid moisture and extreme temperatures.
- When storing for extended periods of time, use dust covers to cover the chairs, or consider wrapping chairs in plastic, to protect them from dust and grime.
- Periodically lubricate the hinges and joints to ensure they open and close smoothly.
- Regularly inspect stored chairs to confirm they remain in good condition, free from moisture or pests.
- Maintain your chairs by keeping the environment's relative humidity between 30% and 40%.
- Protect chairs from prolonged direct sunlight and extreme temperatures to preserve their condition.



# Plastic

## **CLEANING**

Use a sponge or soft brush with warm, soapy water to scrub the plastic chairs, giving extra attention to any stains or grime.

## **STAIN REMOVAL**

For tough stains or mildew, try a mix of equal parts water and white vinegar. Apply it to the spots, let it sit for a few minutes, then scrub and rinse.

## **DRYING**

Whenever possible, let the chairs dry in sunlight—this helps naturally disinfect and freshen them up.

## **WHAT TO AVOID**

Steer clear of abrasive cleaners like scouring powders or steel wool, as these can scratch and dull the plastic's finish.



# Wood

*Always test a new cleaning product in an inconspicuous area to ensure it is safe to use*

## **CLEANING**

Wipe the wood with warm, soapy water and dry it completely with a cloth to avoid water spots.

## **STAIN REMOVAL**

For common stains like red wine, use a little fingernail polish remover or chlorine bleach to lift the mark.

## **HOUSEHOLD CLEANERS**

Most household cleaners work fine on wood but skip ammonia-based products—they can cloud the finish.

## **WHAT TO AVOID**

Avoid abrasive cleaners and scouring pads to prevent scratching.

## **DRYING**

Make sure the surface is fully dried after cleaning to avoid water damage.

## **REFINISHING TOUCH**

To keep your surface looking great, treat it like fine, non-laminated furniture. How often it's washed will guide how often it needs a touch-up.

## **STANDARD SATIN FINISH**

For a satin look, just apply Emmet's Good Stuff Gel Urethane with a rag. A quick refinish every 2-3 weeks, depending on use, should keep it looking fresh.

## **CUSTOM GLOSSY FINISH**

For a glossy finish, use Boos® EZ-DO Finish with a rag. Refinishing every 3-4 weeks, based on usage, will help maintain its shine.
